Dandelions are blooming in lawns. Violets are beginning to show themselves. Some people think of violets and dandelions as pests in their yard. Actually they are most welcome plants. They are the first pollinator plants of the season. Look for bees and other bugs happily finding pollen and nectar with these plants.

Don't forget to look up! Our trees are ready to burst they are so happy with warm days. The red maple leads the hardwood trees with its delicate beautiful red blooms. Shagbark Hickory has large flower-like buds that are bit later than maples. The fruit trees are coming into bloom now and are gorgeous.

When you look at the branch tips against the sky, all the trees have made lace for us.

There are no leaves yet, but the buds are swelling at the branch tips. Against the sky the branch patterns are soft and fluffy, like lace. Trees go from bud to leaves very quickly. You can see the difference every day.
